Broadford Primary School:

No further update as yet – Broadford & Strath Community Council remain very supportive of the plight to get a new Primary School for the community.

Pathway from the new build houses to the Primary School – Still no contact received from landowner as yet

School/Hall access:

Hamish has written again to Highland Council and the Hall carpark deeds should now be signed very shortly which will allow for the designation of the carpark as the official drop-off and pickup point for the school to be moved forward. That in turn will allow us to move on speed restrictions in that area.

Redesign Of Health & Social Care:

There are no new updates at present to report with further meetings pending.

Road Issues:

The roads are in a desperate poor state with numerous potholes - Reports that work has been done to repair the roads in parts of the Island.

There is no road markings left at the Elgol junction in Broadford – Norma Morrison to highlight BSCC concerns to local Cllrs.

Parking meter at the top end of Broadford to be commissioned in April/May.

AOCB:

It has been reported that the small garden area at the Co-op is looking very untidy, overgrown with a lot of litter gathering in it – Letter to be written requesting it be looked into.

BSCC support the Cycle Path project.

Unconfirmed reports that the fuel pumps in Broadford are to close for a period of time to get refurbished – To get clarity from the Co-op about this.

Elgol Public Toilets – Highland Council are in talks with Elgol Village Hall Association to transfer the ownership of the toilets to them in order for them to remain open.

Email received from member of the public enquiring if the BSCC Notice Board at the Co-op could be used by the Public – Agreed by all that it could be used by charitable organisations only and a Policy will be written up.

Public Discussion:

One member of public in attendance who has concerns with the new parking meter in the Village.
