THE WOODLAND

23 hectares, purchased by BSCC on behalf of the community in 2011


Projects on the site so far include: Growers Hub, outdoor learning, woodland path, Camping Skye, event space 2ha mature sitka plantation remaining - what to do with it?

Constraints:

- Low timber quality/ availability
- Unsuitable ground conditions
- Poor access



WOODLAND MANAGEMENT OPTIONS



Option 2 - cut to 'waste'/ mulch

Option 3 - cut to extract




OPTION 1- LET NATURE TAKE ITS COURSE

- Site would appear to be able to regenerate largely by itself
- On previously cleared areas pioneer birch wood has taken hold one of the drier areas
- The wetter areas appear to be reverting to peat
 - With minimal intervention site might regenerate further by itself
- Protect paths, control invasive species, remove unsafe trees, H&S management
 - Low input, low cost, involves volunteers



OPTION 2 - MANAGED REGENERATION

- In addition the unfelled areas could be felled, restructured and/ or 'cut to waste'
- Active replanting of native species
- Hydrological surveys to ascertain what additional works might be required to allow peatland regeneration
- The extent that this can be done depends on available funds - very little revenue generated



OPTION 3 - ADDITIONAL ACQUISITION

- Acquire neighbouring HIE owned plantation
- Harvesting of that timber would allow economic extraction of existing BSCC conifers
- Enabling complete clearance of upper part of site, initially leading to a fairly radical change in the appearance of the site
- A 'blank canvass' approach could then be applied for replanting/ peatland regen
 - Budgets would be less restricted
- Opportunity to expand path network/ access

NEW WOODLAND ACQUISITION

The **Opportunity**

- 10ha woodland, adjacent to BSCC boundary, owned by Highlands & Islands Enterprise (HIE)
- Mature trees need felling
- HIE open to Asset Transfer Request negotiation
- Would open up enterprise opportunities on BSCC woodland
- Enhanced forest access/ amenity new paths, benches, interpretation

Asset Transfer Process

- Two routes available:
- 1.Negotiated purchase: An off-market purchase at market value.
- 2.Asset Transfer Request (ATR): Apply to HIE to purchase via Asset Transfer legislation.

Capacity to Deliver

- Would require development work, e.g. business case for acquisition (showing community benefits), community consultation, valuation, fundraising (e.g. Scottish Land Fund).
- Woodland action plan will investigate further, and make key recommendations to address capacity.

HIE WOODLAND ACQUISITION Enterprise Ideas

Purchase of a Sawmill & Timber Processing Yard to develop the following:

- **Glamping Pods** sustainable build using local timber & skills
- **Timber Products** micro business, new income stream
- Improvements to existing infrastructure e.g. timber for The Growers Hub, Corry Capers
- Wood fuel addressing fuel poverty
- Forest playpark safe place for children to play
- **Skills development** land-based courses, woodworking

Woodland crofts - vision for a living, working forest

OTHER ENTERPRISE IDEAS

POSSIBLE WITHOUT HIE ACQUISITION, TO DELIVER EMPLOYMENT, NEW SERVICES, SUSTAINABILITY

- **Christmas Trees -** could be developed within proposed tree nursery. Could be run alongside native tree planting efforts. 'Rent a tree' model, reduce waste
- Woodland Ashes Burials option to develop environmentally sensitive ashes site within native woodland, factoring in commemorative trees/ plaques/ benches
- Wind Turbine to power campsite potential for a 10kW turbine to offset electricity bills to the campsite
